The Prize? We Have Three Door prizes which are **\$50 Amazon Gift Cards**. I wish it could be more, but I just carried on about the expense of providing you this 3 Day Weekend. ☺

There seemed to be some confusion with my reference to attire when I said, "Snappy Casual~ Snappy Chic. No Rules. You Define it!"

I was simply saying today's dress is, "Open Season."

Now, considering we're the Class of 76, Hindsight being 20/20:
